Teacher/School Responsibilities:

Lyerly Elementary School students will have a Lexile increase of at least 100L.

- Teach classes through interesting and challenging lessons that promote student achievement.
- Have high expectations and help every child to develop a love of learning.
- Communicate regularly with families about student progress.
- Help each student achieve the school's high academic standards.
